ORDER

Upon the application, brought on by way of order to show cause, of Shirin Emami, Acting Superintendent of Financial Services of the State of New York in her capacity as liquidator (the "Liquidator") of United Community Insurance Company ("UCIC") for an order, inter alia, closing the above-referenced liquidation proceeding (the "Motion") and upon all other papers previously submitted and all proceedings heretofore had herein, and it appearing that the Liquidator provided notice of the Motion as directed by the Court and has filed affidavits of service evidencing such compliance, and this matter having come on for a hearing on February 22, 2016, and no opposition having been served;

NOW, on motion of the Liquidator, and after due deliberation having been had thereon, it is

ORDERED, that the Motion is granted; and it is further

ORDERED, the report on the status of and request to close the UCIC liquidation proceeding and the financial transactions delineated in such report are approved; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator is authorized to continue paying administrative expenses, including such expenses for the closing of the UCIC liquidation proceeding; and it is further

ORDERED, that the UCIC liquidation proceeding is terminated and closed; and it is further


ORDERED, that the NYLB is authorized to continue, after the termination of the UCIC liquidation proceeding, to receive and disburse assets to those creditors of UCIC with allowed Class two claims who are eligible to share in a *pro-rata* distribution and to pay any and all administrative expenses incurred in connection with the collection and disbursement of any such assets; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator, and her successors in office and their agents and employees, are entitled to judicial immunity for any cause of action of any nature against them, individually or jointly; for any acts or omissions when acting in good faith, in accordance with the orders of this Court and/or in the performance of their duties pursuant to Insurance Law Article 74; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator, her predecessors and successors in office, and their agents, attorneys and employees, are released and discharged from any and all liability arising from their acts or omissions in connection with the UCIC liquidation proceeding.
